

RESOLUTION NO. R-2013-106

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE A PURCHASE ORDER FOR A SPECIAL WEAPONS AND TACTICS (SWAT) VAN TO BE PLACED IN SERVICE BY THE NORTH MIAMI POLICE DEPARTMENT, AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY DOLLARS (\$108,780.00) FROM THE FEDERAL EQUITABLE SHARING FUNDS ACCOUNT, TO PIGGYBACK A COMPETITIVE BID AWARD BY THE SHERIFFS' OFFICES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA COOPERATIVE BID FOR PURSUIT, ADMINISTRATIVE, UTILITY VEHICLES, TRUCKS AND VANS - BID NUMBER 12-20-905; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR ALL OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2012, the Florida Sheriffs Association, Florida Association of Counties and Florida Fire Chiefs' Association ("Association") successfully issued bid awards from its 20th statewide competitive bid for *Pursuit, Administrative, Utility Vehicles, Trucks and Vans – Bid Number 12-20-0905* ("Award"), on behalf of participating police and fire departments, and local municipal governments of the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Award is designed to provide participating agencies and local municipal governments, with a mechanism for increasing their purchasing power by offering the most economically priced patrol, administrative, utility vehicles, trucks and vans, and other fleet equipment, tailored to the agency's specific needs; and

WHEREAS, the Association guarantees participating agencies and local municipal governments, the availability of the Award to selected vendors ("Vendors"), for the period commencing November 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013, as long as vehicles are available; and

WHEREAS, the City administration has identified the need for a Special Weapons and Tactics ("SWAT") Van for use by the North Miami Police Department to, among other things, transport SWAT personnel serving high risk search warrants, approach and neutralize barricaded subjects, and to facilitate hostage negotiations; and

WHEREAS, the SWAT Van to be purchased constitutes a crucial element for the City Police Department to continue to provide essential services, vital to the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, at cost not exceed One Hundred Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$108,780.00); and

WHEREAS, the funding source for the cost of the SWAT Van is derived from the Federal Equitable Sharing Funds Account, designated to the City; and

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2007, the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Miami, adopted Ordinance 1244, which authorizes the City Manager to approve the purchase of supplies, goods and/or services from current contracts of other governmental entities (“piggyback”), such as the Florida Sheriffs Association, Florida Association of Counties and Florida Fire Chiefs’ Association; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has determined that it is in the City’s best interest to piggyback the Award in order to expeditiously purchase the SWAT Van, utilizing the most cost effective means currently available to the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI, FLORIDA:

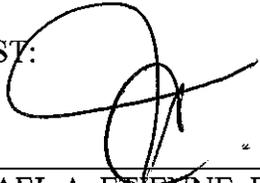
Section 1. Authority of City Manager. The Mayor and City Council of the City of North Miami, hereby authorize the City Manager to issue purchase order for a Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Van to be placed in service by the North Miami Police Department, at a cost not to exceed One Hundred Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$108,780.00) from the Federal Equitable Sharing Funds Account, to piggyback a competitive bid award by the Sheriffs’ Offices and Local Governmental Agencies of the State of Florida Cooperative Bid for Pursuit, Administrative, Utility Vehicles, Trucks and Vans - Bid Number 12-20-905.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by a 5-0 vote of the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Miami, Florida, this 10 day of September, 2013.

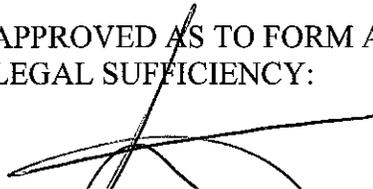
