RE: Appointment of Code Enforcement Special Magistrate



RECOMMENDATION

The Police Department recommends that Rafael Suarez-Rivas, Esq., be appointed as a Code Enforcement Special Magistrate for the City of North Miami.

BACKGROUND

Under Section 2-108 of City of North Miami Code of Ordinances, and pursuant to Florida Statutes, Ch. 162.03(2), special magistrates designated and determined to be qualified by the City Council shall have authority to adjudicate ordinance violations.

To be eligible for service as a special magistrate, a person must either: be a retired Florida judge, or be a member in good standing of the Florida Bar for at least five (5) years.

By code, a special magistrate's term of appointment shall be limited to one (1) year, and a special magistrate may be re-appointed by the City Council provided that said magistrate possesses the qualifications required by code.

Mr. Suarez-Rivas is a member in good standing with the Florida Bar since April 4, 1980, and he is eligible to practice law in Florida.

RESOLUTION NO. _____

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF RAFAEL SUAREZ-RIVAS, ESQ., AS BACKUP SPECIAL MAGISTRATE FOR CODE ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER AND THE CITY ATTORNEY TO EXECUTE A ONE (1) YEAR LETTER OF AGREEMENT WITH THE BACKUP SPECIAL MAGISTRATE, IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE ATTACHED FORM; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND ALL OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of North Miami's ("City") Code of Ordinances ("Code") allows for the appointment of up to three Special Magistrates for Code Enforcement procedures; and

WHEREAS, the City Code requires that the Special Magistrates be either retired Florida judges or members in good standing of the Florida Bar for at least five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, City Administration has reviewed the qualifications of the proposed backup Special Magistrate and determined the candidate to be the best suited for the needs of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to designate and appoint the recommended candidate as backup Special Magistrate for Code Enforcement proceedings for a one (1) year period with an option to renew for an additional one (1) year term.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Designation of Special Magistrate. The Mayor and City Council of the City of North Miami, Florida, hereby authorize the appointment of Rafael Suarez-Rivas, Esq., as backup Special Magistrate for Code Enforcement proceedings, and authorize the City Manager and the City Attorney to execute a one (1) year Letter of Agreement with the backup Special Magistrate, in substantially the attached form.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

RE: APPOINTMENT AS BACKUP SPECIAL MAGISTRATE

Dear Attorney Suarez-Rivas:

This correspondence sets forth a Letter of Agreement (“Agreement”) between the City of North Miami, a Florida municipal corporation (“City”), and Rafael Suarez-Rivas, Esq., as an independent legal contractor for Code Enforcement proceedings, as may be required by the City from time to time (“Backup Special Magistrate”). The City and Backup Special Magistrate shall collectively be referred to as the “Parties”.

The Parties agree as follows:

1. **Appointment of the Backup Special Magistrate:** Pursuant to the City Charter, the City Council appoints Attorney Rafael Suarez-Rivas, as a Backup Special Magistrate, effective April 11, 2012.
2. **Term:** This Agreement is for a term of one (1) year with an option to renew for an additional one (1) year term, unless earlier terminated pursuant to this Agreement.
3. **Independent Contractor:** The Backup Special Magistrate shall be deemed as an independent contractor and not an agent or employee of the City. The Backup Special Magistrate shall not attain any rights or benefits under the City’s Civil Service or Pension Ordinances or any rights generally afforded to City classified, or unclassified employees. Therefore, the Backup Special Magistrate is not entitled to Florida Workers’ Compensation benefits.
4. **Compensation:** The Backup Special Magistrate shall be compensated at \$125.00 per hour for services, non-inclusive of travel time to and from Code Enforcement hearings.
5. **Right of City to Terminate:** The City retains the right to terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice, at any time prior to the Term of this Agreement without penalty. The City shall only be responsible to pay the Backup Special Magistrate for any services actually rendered up to the date of termination.
6. **Notice:** All notices or other communications which shall or may be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered by personal service, or by registered mail addressed to the other party at the address indicated, or as may be changed from time to time. Such notice shall be deemed given on the day on which personally served, or if by mail, on the date of actual receipt.
