Mr. Johnson, City Manager and Aleem Ghany, Public Works Director, gave brief reports to Council. Mayor Pierre placed Tab B, back into the Consent Agenda. Council voted to approve the Consent Agenda, Tabs A and B; passed unanimously.

TAB C – PROPOSED RESOLUTION URGING THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO DENY APPROVAL OF ANY FURTHER “EARLY COST RECOVERY” AND URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL THE “EARLY COST RECOVERY” STATUTE RELATING TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CHARGES FOR SITING, DESIGNING, LICENSING, AND CONSTRUCTION OF NUCLEAR PLANTS

TAB D – PROPOSED RESOLUTION PROPOSING THE EXECUTION OF A LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NORTH MIAMI, AS LANDLORD AND OLETA PARTNERS, LLC, AS TENANT, FOR THE PREMISES KNOWN AS “BISCAYNE LANDING”; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE TERMS OF THE LEASE AGREEMENT

Michael A. Etienne, Esquire, read the Resolution title for the record. Public discussion. Peyton Lumpkin, Attorney representing the City for Biscayne Landing, gave a brief report to Council. Council discussion. Michael Swerdlow, Developer, gave a brief report to Council regarding the project. No motion made. Mayor Pierre directed the City Manager to put out

another RFP, for 30 to 45 days, with all language referencing money spent up front and referencing money directed to an educational fund stricken.

Councilman Blynn moved to approve the Resolution, seconded by Vice Mayor Marcellus; failed 1-3, by roll call vote. Mayor Pierre, Vice Mayor Marcellus and Councilman Galvin denied. Councilwoman Steril abstained from voting.

Mayor Pierre directed the City Manager to put out another RFP, for 30 to 45 days, with all language referencing money spent up front and referencing money directed to an educational fund stricken.

CITIZENS' FORUM

COUNCIL REPORTS

Mayor Pierre moved to direct the City Manager to put out another RFP for 30 to 45 days with all language referencing money spent up front and referencing money directed to an educational fund stricken, seconded by Vice Mayor Marcellus, passed 3-2. Councilman Blynn and Councilman Galvin denied.

CITY CLERK'S REPORT

Mr. Etienne reminded Mayor and Council of the procedure for appointments to various Boards and requested Mayor and Council provide names and contact information so that potential members can be sent an application by the City Clerk's office and vetted.

Mr. Etienne advised Council of a Board application received from Crystal Chow, requesting to be appointed to the Youth Opportunity Board. Vice Mayor Marcellus has an opening on the Youth Opportunity Board.

Mr. Etienne updated Council on the process for Board members that are not attending monthly Board meetings.

Mr. Etienne advised passport application activities have increased due to advertising on Spanish and Haitian radio.

Mayor Pierre inquired as to why District 2 is always the Vice Mayor during the

Presidential election. Mr. Etienne reported after researching the query extensively, no information was found but he would continue to research the Florida Statutes to find a reference for rotation of the Vice Mayor.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Council welcomed Regine Monestime, City Attorney. Ms. Monestime advised Council she was happy to be in North Miami and appreciated the wise leadership in Council selecting her as City Attorney.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Johnson thanked Ronald Galdos, Interim City Attorney for his hard work and looks forward to working with Ms. Monestime.

Mr. Johnson advised Council the CRA Budget 2010-11, 2011-12, passed and would be moving forward to the BCC in April.

Mr. Johnson advised traffic circles along Pioneer Boulevard in District 3, are being completed.

Mr. Johnson advised the city would be moving forward aggressively with Code Enforcement issues to improve the quality of life in the city.

Mr. Ghany advised backflow devices located in the traffic circles on the west side have been stolen.

NEW BUSINESS

John Dellagloria, Attorney for Developer of Biscayne Landing, addressed Council requesting as a courtesy, to meet with Mayor and Council regarding the outcome of the proposed Resolution approving the lease agreement for Biscayne Landing that failed earlier in the meeting and requested Council hold off for two weeks until the next Council meeting before sending out the RFP.

ADJOURNMENT
