Library Cards

Library cards are free to North Miami residents and City employees regardless of residency. Reciprocal borrowing privileges are available for residents of Hialeah, North Miami Beach and the Miami-Dade Public Library System Taxing District at no charge. There is a charge for residents of Bal Harbour, Miami Shores, Surfside and out-of-the-area residents who wish to apply for a library card.

All applicants must be present when application is completed. Anyone under 18 years of age must have parental authorization to obtain a card.

Who Was E. MAY AVIL? NAMING THE LIBRARY FOR E. MAY AVIL

The first library services to area residents were offered in 1932, when the Biscayne Park Women's Club established a library in the City Hall of the town of North Miami.

Women's Club member E. May Avil, who eventually served 37 years as City Clerk for the Town of North Miami, was put in charge of overseeing the library operation.

World War II brought about the close of the library as unessential to the war effort. However, the North Miami Community Library was reopened in September 1945, in larger quarters at the City Hall and, again, under the supervision of E. May Avil. Funding came largely from donations and membership fees.

In 1970 the City Council voted unanimously to rename the Library as the E. May Avil North Miami Public Library.

The newsletter was the idea of Founder Sharon Sbrissa, who budgeted funds from the Friends' endowment fund which she administers. At her request, it was created in 2013 by its editor Susan Neuman, and was named by John Criscuolo, Susan's late husband, one of the few male members of the Friends.
