AWARDED *for* OUTSTANDING PROGRAM

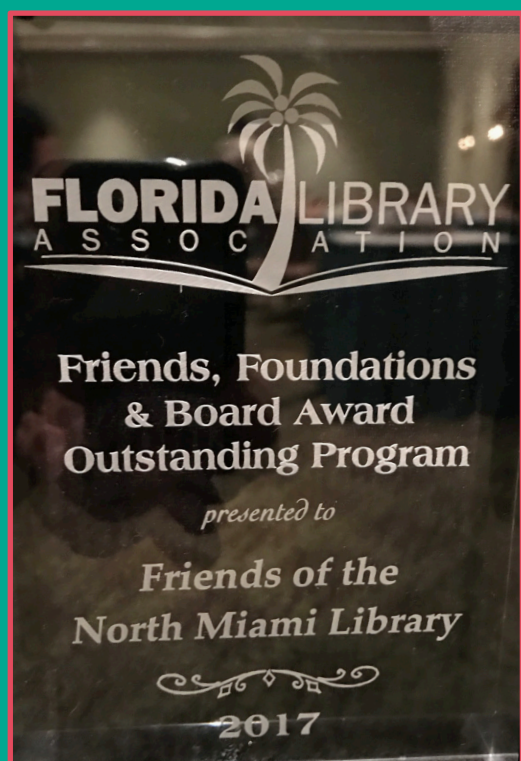
The Friends of the North Miami Public Library received the "Outstanding Program" award for their special programming activities and public relations events to attract the community to the library from the Florida Library Association. "The Wonderful Feast: Celebration of the Life and Work of Children's Author and Artist Esphyr Slobodkina" was a year-long celebration.

The celebration began with the restoration and rehang of The Wonderful Feast, a large wood-painted two-wall mural, a gift from the artist, which illustrated her children's book of the same name. Events continued thru Earth Day, the Summer Reading Program and culminated with a world-class traveling exhibition of 32 of Slobodkina's creations in November and December 2016.

This included paintings, sculptures, collages, wall hangings, dolls and original book illustrations from the New York-based Slobodkina Foundation. Musical presentations of Caps for Sale, another of Slobodkina's books, and the gifting of over 600 hardcopy books to children attending library events, captivated and enriched our community children.

RUNS TO AUGUST 12TH

The Friends of the North Miami Public Library and the library staff have an exciting summer planned for all age groups from toddlers to teens in the 2017 Summer Reading Program, with prizes for the winners and many raffle rewards along the way. The program runs from June 1 to August 12.

This year's theme, "Build A Better World", will include storytelling, movies, arts and crafts, book clubs for children, magicians and animal shows.

In 2016, over 700 people signed up for Summer Reading activities, making weekly visits to the library to enjoy activities, borrow materials, and vie for prizes. Excited participants turned out for the final drawing at the end of the summer reading program.

 Library System Taxing District at no
 charge. There is a charge for residents

 and out-of-the-area residents who wish
 to apply for a library card.

All applicants must be present when
 application is completed. Anyone under
 18 years of age must have parental
 authorization to obtain a card.

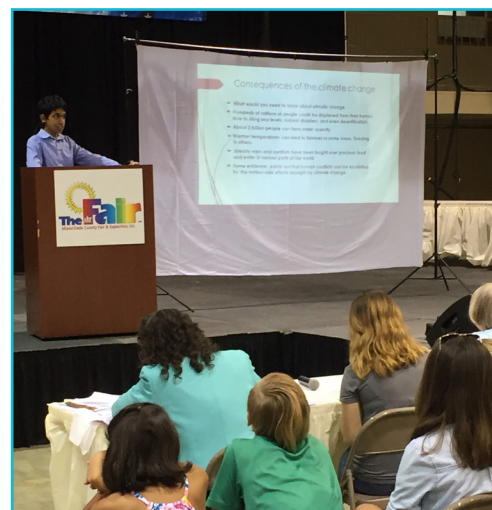

Congratulations to the North Miami Green Teens for their hard work and sacrifice!



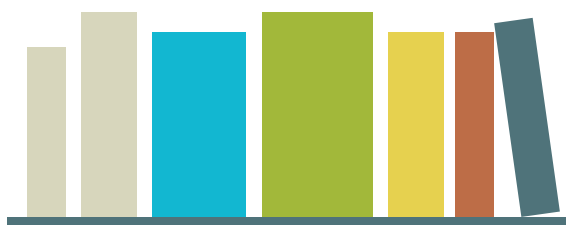

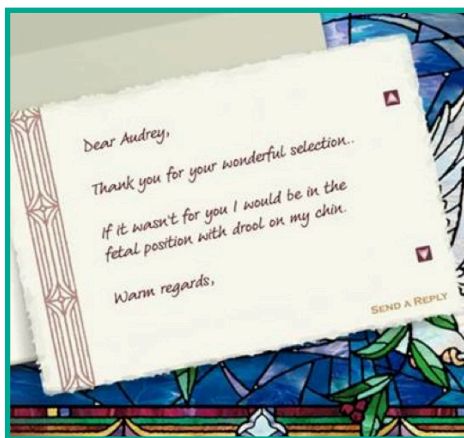
